# How to Read the Acadience Math Report

Attached is the first Acadience Math Report for the year. Here are some things to look for:

- 1. In each section of the report, check to see that your child has improved his/her score from the last month of the new month. If your child recently took the Acadience Math Test for the first time this year, then he/she will have only last month's score.
- 2. Look at the Composite score, This score was generated the first time your child took the test. The score will not change until January when we take the next benchmark test.
- 3. The colors are as follows: Green = At or Above Benchmark your child is where he/she should be in this area. Yellow = Below Benchmark you child needs to improve in this area. Pink = Well Below Benchmark your child needs to do a lot of practice in this area to be where he/she needs to be.
- 4. If your child has taken the Acadience Math Test several times already this year, compare the scores between the months. Your child's score should be improving each month in that area. If not, he/she needs to practice more in that area.

There are suggestions on the Progress Report of what your child can work on to improve in math.

The students in MTSS Math take the Acadience Math Test once a month. You will be receiving a copy of the report after testing.
