Why Early Middle College at Ida?

To address needs in the following areas:

- Identify students who may be at risk of not attending college
- Assist in completion of students' first year
- Support first generation students
- Provide support for students in overcoming barriers to complete a degree or certificate

To strengthen our successful relationship with Monroe County Community College:

- 50% attended MCCC from last year's graduates
- Power of location

Process of Development

- Networked with area Early College Programs
- Attended MEMCA Conferences to gather information
- Met with Monroe Community College to discuss design options





IEMC

- Offering students an opportunity to complete a high school diploma and up to first two years of college in five years
- Encouraging more students to consider college
- Promoting a culture of higher level learning for all students

Early Middle College Qualifying Process

- Presentations in 8th, 9th, and 10th grade
- Parent and Student Information Night during 8th and 10th grade
- Application Process
- Teacher Evaluation/Recommendation
- Selection
 - Assesses college readiness, academic and social/emotional maturity
- Individual Interview with Applicants
- Individual plan developed based on student's level of readiness

Core Components

- Formal Partnership with Monroe County Community College
- Selection Process to determine college readiness
- Classes taken on MCCC Campus and Online
- Ida Counselors
 - Advising, communication, assessing progress
 - IEMC Monthly Seminar

Example of Student Schedule

Exact schedule will be determined in conjunction with Ida Counselors based on readiness

- 11th Grade: 5-7 classes/semester at Ida
 0-2 MCCC course/semester
- 12th Grade: 3-7 classes/semester at Ida
 0-3 MCCC courses/semester

Example, Cont.

- 13th Year: all MCCC courses (minimum of 12 credits each semester)
 - Schedule determined after meeting with MCCC Academic Advisor and approval of IHS Counselor
 - Must have a Financial Lit course requirement approved by Ida High School Board of Education


Academic Preparation and Alignment

- Assuring a good transition for our students from IHS to MCCC
- Individual planning meetings with students to map out course of study
- Accuplacer to determine placement for all 10th graders
- Orientation, Campus Tour
- Constant evaluation of students' success in high school and college classes



Non-CORE Content Skill Development

- Process (HSSIT) to identify students who are in need of support
- Teacher Evaluation/Recommendation
- College Success Course available for identified students
- Additional Support and Mentoring from Ida Counselors
- Embed study skills, note taking, and test taking skills in English classes
- Career Cruising



Social Maturity Development

- Individual Student Interviews
- Teacher Evaluation/Recommendation
- Based on Selection, students who score low due to social maturity have:
 - Safety Nets
 - Schedule Parental Meeting
 - Attendance, Academic, or Behavioral Contracts
 - College Success Course Required
 - Social/Emotional Counseling
